

# COVID-19 GUIDANCE FOR PERSONAL TRAVEL/VACATIONS

Alltech’s culture of care extends to supporting all employees with information for safe decision-making regardless of the situation and environment.

Taking vacation is important and is recognized as beneficial to our team members' health and well-being. However, we are currently living in extraordinary times as we learn to cope with COVID-19. In that context, we are providing the following to aid employees when thinking about taking vacation during 2020.

## Consider your answers to the following questions:

Question	Response

Does your local or national government advise against traveling to the location you intend to visit (because of COVID-19)?	Red	Green
Does the local government at the destination advise visitors against traveling there (because of COVID-19)?	Red	Green
Is the destination currently experiencing an upturn in the number of new daily COVID-19 cases?	Red	Green
Are there any quarantine measures that may have to be adhered to (e.g., on return from the location)?	Red	Green
If so, have you built that quarantine time into your vacation?	Green	Red
Are you able to work remotely if you need to quarantine when you return? (A visit to a known high-risk area may result in unpaid quarantine time on return).	Green	Red
Does the journey to the destination involve using public transport, particularly airplanes?	Red	Green
Has the accommodation at your destination made any special provisions for managing COVID-19 during your stay?	Green	Red
Are you planning to stay with other people? If so, do you know their health status with regard to COVID-19?	Green	Red
Do you know what the PPE requirements are at the location you are visiting, for example, in public places?	Green	Red



## Other points to check and/or be aware of:



The virus is still among us, and the situation remains uncertain. Keep in mind that your vacation may well be different than usual.



You may be checked for symptoms of COVID-19 at the border, for example, when traveling in Europe.



Check whether your travel and/or life insurance policy covers you for the intended travel in relation to any COVID-19 issues.



Be aware that the situation can change very quickly. This can result in sudden changes by local authorities, such as the locking down of amenities and the cancellation of travel routes.



If you experience symptoms of COVID-19 during your stay in another country, report to the local health authorities for a test. Avoid contact with others pending the outcome, and, if you test positive, always follow local advice. This may mean that you (together with your travel companions) will be quarantined.
